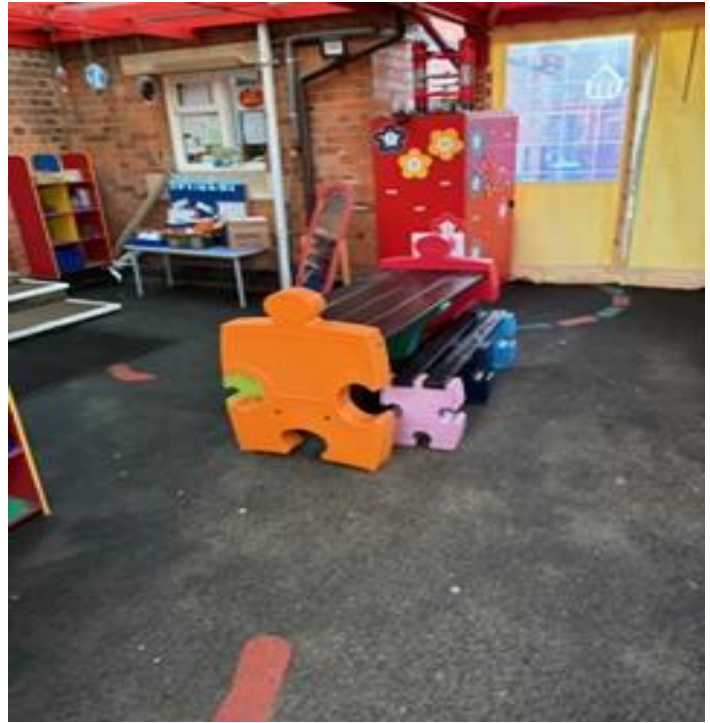
Each club is £5 per child for the hour. Paid half termly in advance. Places are limited and will be offered on a first come first served basis. Please complete a booking form with your requests.

Happy New Year! We are thrilled to welcome you to the weeks and months ahead, packed with exciting events to look forward to.

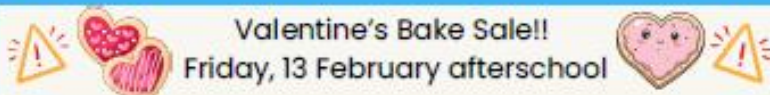
