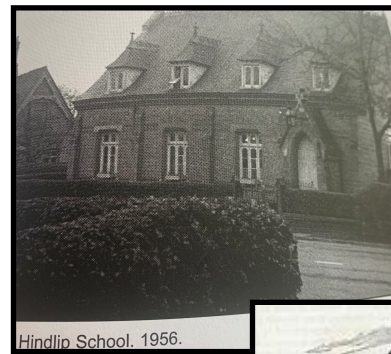


100 years of Hindlip

During this local history topic, we will investigate how the village of Fernhill Heath and our school have changed over the past 100 years. We will be talking to different residents who have seen the changes, visiting the local area and using various artefacts (photographs, diary entries, school log books, maps) to evaluate and understand the historical changes.

Locality	A neighbourhood or area.
Significant	Someone or something very important.
Community	A group of people who live in the same area or who have something in common.
District	An area of a country, city or town.
Parish	A small place with its own church.
County	An area of a country which usually includes several towns or countryside.
Region	A large area of land which has noticeable features.

heritage	The history and traditions of a particular area or culture that are significant today.
heritage trail	A walking trail, often in a public place, that highlights important cultural objects, such as buildings, from the past.
living memory	A time that can be remembered by people who are still alive.
beyond living memory	Events that happened a long time ago and cannot be remembered by people who are alive today.
Historical source	something that tells us about history.

How do we know if this History is true?

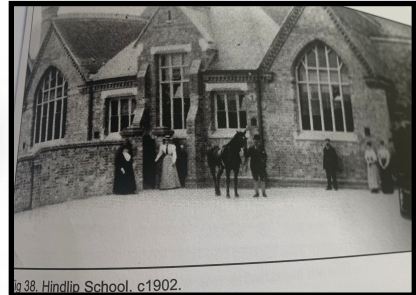


How has the area changed?
