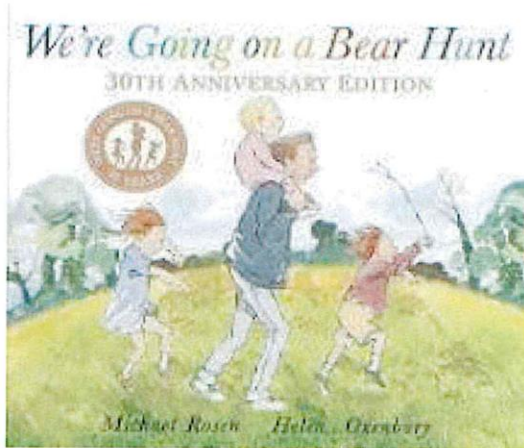


# Red Class Knowledge Organiser - Journeys

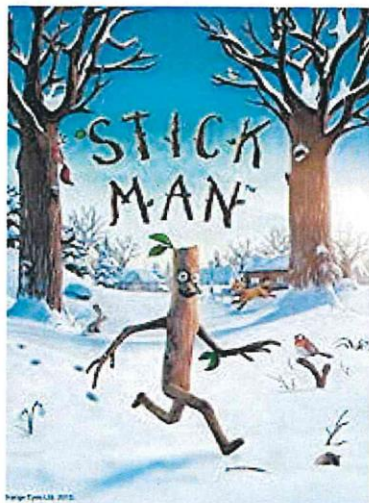

Stick Man lived in the family tree. We will be thinking about our family trees. Can you help your child learn about their family tree! We will collect sticks from our garden and make Stick Man!

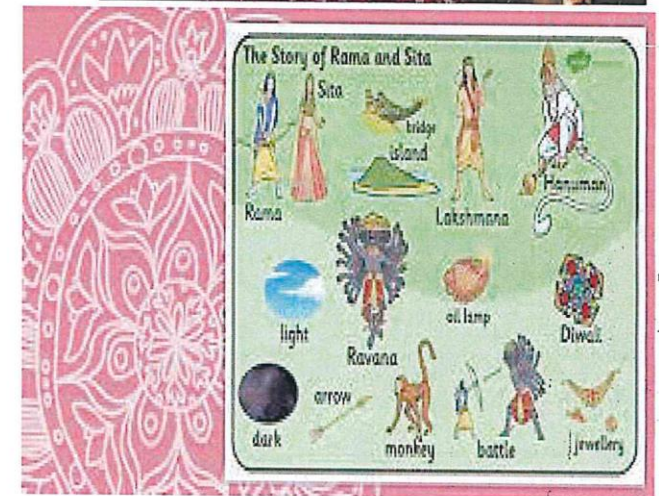
## Journeys!
